## What do students study whilst at the Academy?

*Our curriculum gives all students the opportunities they need to learn and achieve.*

It will build on students' strengths, interests and experiences and develop their skills to enable them to become confident, life long learners. Students will be quipped with the core skills of literacy, numeracy and information and communication technology that will enable them to thrive in an uncertain and changing world. Learning will be presented in a variety of contexts which will enable students to develop a broad range of knowledge, understanding and skills. The curriculum will enable students to work with creativity and imagination.

**During Key stage 3** all students have the opportunity to study a broad and balanced curriculum. In *Year 7* all students study Mathematics, English, Science, Art, Drama, Music, History, Geography, French, RE (religious education), DT (design technology), ICT (information and communication technology) and PE (physical education). In *Year 8* students study a second modern foreign language in either Spanish or German.

**During Key Stage 4** all students study the statutory requirements of the National Curriculum in English (language and literature), Mathematics, Science, RE and PE. In addition students also have the opportunity to select subjects and qualifications that meet their own needs and aspirations. Currently we have the following options: art, French, Spanish, German, History, Geography, Textiles, Catering, Product Design, Resistant Materials, ICT, Business Studies, Child Development, Sport BTEC, Drama, Music, ASDAN and work related learning.

**During Key Stage 5** students are encouraged to remain at Huish Sixth. Our post 16 curriculum offers a range of A level qualifications and BTEC qualifications.

*All students* study aspects of Citizenship and Personal and Health Education.

*All students* at Huish Episcopi Academy are encouraged to extend their learning and experiences beyond lessons by participating in extra curricular and enrichment activities. Sports clubs and fixtures, foreign residentials and exchange visits, choirs and orchestra, warhammer and library clubs, outdoor activities and Duke of Edinburgh award are just a small selection of the opportunities available.
