YR13 exam update and information

End of year arrangements:

- A'level students must be available up to and including June 28th (this is the contingency day for any exams that need to be rearranged).
- BTEC/OCR Technicals students must be available until they are told by their course leader they have completed all submissions and re-submissions of assignments. The latest date to enter BTEC grades is July 5th and latest moderation visits for OCR Technicals is 30th June).
- All students should attend lessons until they have completed all exams / assignments in that subject.

Results day:

- Thursday 17th August 2023
- School will be open for students to collect results in person from 9am
- Any results not collected will be posted home at the end of the day
- We can only email results directly to students- not parents



UCAS choices:

- Deadline for confirming choices is June 8th after this all offers will be withdrawn.
- Firm choice is your preferred option.
- Insurance choice is your back-up option if you don't get the grades for your firm choice. The entry requirements should be lower grades or offer flexibility through a points total rather than grades.
- If your firm choice is unconditional, you don't get an insurance choice.
- You cannot change your mind on results day if you get offered your place for your firm choice your insurance place is automatically withdrawn.
- If you have already changed your mind it's not too late to do something about it; please come and see me.



UCAS decisions:

- You will be able to see if you have gained your firm or insurance choice on the UCAS website after approximately 8am on results day (17th August) the site is in high demand so do be patient.
- Make sure you are available on results day because UCAS can't speak to anyone else about your application details unless you give them nominated access to speak on your behalf.
- If you do not receive your firm or insurance offer we will be available to help you understand what options are now available to you when you come in to collect your results.

What your status in your application means and what to do next

Your status in your application	What this means	What you should do next
You have replied to your offer(s) and are holding at least one conditional place.	We are waiting for your university or college to let us know if you've met the conditions and have been accepted.	If you meet the conditions of your offer(s), the university or college will confirm your place in your application. (You then might need to send them details of your results if they ask for them.)
Congratulations! Your place at [uni name] for [course title] has been confirmed.	You're in! You've been firmly accepted at the university or college shown.	Great news! Make sure you check the details carefully in your application. Then you should receive details from the university or college about what to do next.
You are in Clearing. Your Clearing number is [Clearing number].	You're not holding any offers at a university or college – this might be because you received no offers or because you didn't meet the conditions of the offers you did receive. Don't worry, you might be able to find another course in our Clearing service. Find out how Clearing works here.	You can now apply for a course available in Clearing. Look for courses when the Clearing vacancy search becomes live within our search tool, then contact the university or college to discuss your options. Then if you get permission you can add the Clearing choice in your application.



[Uni name] has offered you an unconditional place with substantial changes to your original choice.

You are now waiting for confirmation from [uni name] (your other university or college).

This means one of your universities or colleges has offered you a changed course offer, but that you're still waiting for your other choice to make a decision.

The changed course offer could be a change to the course itself, the start date or the point of entry.

This is usually if you didn't meet the conditions but the university or college wants to offer you an alternative place anyway.

Check the details of the changed course offer in your application.

If the changed course offer is your firm choice, you can accept it now if you want to study that course. Or you can wait to see if your insurance choice confirms your offer – if so you'll be able to accept that instead if you want.

If the changed course offer is your insurance offer, you'll have to wait to see if your firm choice confirms you.

At least one of your universities or colleges has offered you an unconditional place with substantial changes to your original choice. This means you've heard back from your choices, and at least one of them is a changed course offer.

This could be a change to the course, start date or point of entry.

This is usually if you didn't meet the conditions but the university or college wants to offer you an alternative place anyway.

Check the details of the changed course offer in your application.

If the changed course offer is your firm choice, you can accept it if you want to study that course. If not, you can accept your insurance choice if they have confirmed your place.

If both offers are changed course offers, then you can accept whichever one you would prefer.

If you want to accept an offer, you'll need to reply in your application within five days or you will lose the offer(s).

Student finance:

- Applications for 2023 starters are open the deadline to apply to guarantee you receive funding for the start of your course is May 19th.
- Deferred entry apply next year.
- You do not need to have received all your offers or confirmed your place – complete the application now and update it as necessary.
 You can also cancel your application if you change your mind.
- Remember to register on your course with your chosen university when you go or you won't receive your loans (universities will provide information on this).



HuishSixth Tuition fee loan:

- Paid directly to your university
- Usually £9250 (foundation degrees / part-time may vary)
- Everyone is eligible for the full loan



HuishSixth Maintenance loan:

- Paid into your student bank account, usually in 3 instalments one at the start of each term.
- The amount you are eligible for depends on your taxable household income.
- The household is classed as where you usually live.
- The household income is the income of your parents or one parent plus their partner living in the household, plus any independent source of income you have such as interest from savings, property etc.
- It does not include any money you will earn from work whilst you are away at university.
- The household will need to provide evidence of income (eg provide National Insurance number)





NO PHONE

You remember **20% less** if you revise with your phone near you.....even if it's off!!

Put it in another room





NO MUSIC!

"But I revise well listening to music"....

Students who revise in quiet environments performed over 60% better than peers who revise listening to music that has lyrics

Your working memory is limited, and any background noise is 'cognitive overload' and will make learning much harder.






Recreate the exam

- You sit the exam in silence, no music and no phone
- You have to revise in silence, with no music and no phone
- Create the same conditions as the exam or your memory will not work as well and you will be unable to recall your knowledge in as much detail

How long should you revise for?

If you just sit down to revise,


without a definite finishing time,
your learning efficiency
falls lower and lower,
like this:





How long should you work for?

If you decide at the beginning of a study session, how long you will work for, with a clock, then as your brain knows the end is coming, the graph rises towards the end






The Pomodoro technique

Space Your Knowledge

Spaced practice/Distributed practice

Spaced practice means allowing time to elapse between learning to make the practice more difficult, producing stronger learning and memory



Remember effort = learning!

Transform

Change your knowledge in some way, engage with it:

effort = learning

Try to come up with different ways to represent the information visually, for example a mindmap, a timeline, revision cards with key terms, or a diagram of parts that work together



Elaborate

Elaborative interrogation, add detail to your knowledge



Elaborative Rehearsal and Interrogation

- Elaborative Rehearsal is when you associate new material with material already learned or with other new learning e.g. using concept maps to link information together.
- Elaborative Interrogation involves asking yourself questions about why and how things work.



Exam Practice

Daniel Willingham says, "practice makes perfect: but only if you practice beyond the point of perfection"

To prevent forgetting you need to learn even after you know the material - a good rule of thumb is to put in another 20% of the time it took to master the material

Practice until you never get it wrong



You can also.....

- Make up exam questions for each of the exam command words
- Write mark-schemes for your questions, highlighting the assessment objectives you are testing (AO1, AO2 and AO3)
- Work with a friend and test each other
- Challenge each other to answer the hardest question you can



Read examiners reports

- Every year the exam boards make public a document that is written by the people who are going to mark your papers
- And in it, they tell you what they like to read
- They also give you examples of what not to do









Retrieve

Retrieval Practice/Low stakes Quizzing/The Testing Effect



Don't practice recognition, practice retrieval

- We mistake our ability to recognize something for an ability to recall it
- Recognition and recall are different psychological processes.
 Recognition is a much easier task
- But in your exam you don't get marks for things being familiar, you get marks for recalling relevant information and using it to answer the question



How do I do it?


- Write from memory.....and then check
- Test yourself frequently MCQ, SAQ, Essays......from memory
- Look, Cover, Write, Check do this with your flashcards
- Create mind-maps from memory use your notes to check and fill in gaps afterwards
- Create tests with answers from memory use your notes to check afterwards

What else works?

- Teaching the material to someone else
- This forces you to think about the material in a clear and structured way



What else works?

- Speak it out loud
- This is an effective strategy to improve recall, more so than just repeating the content in your own head.
- Research has found that it can improve recall by 12%



What should I do?



- Get organized- make a timetable
- Revise continually.
- Little and often



- Don't have any distractions when your revising
- Make your revision active NOT passive
- Sleep, eat, drink water- look after yourselves
