

Last week Huish Sixth took 13 of our highest achieving A'Level students to Cambridge University as part of the Cambridge HE Plus programme. The trip involved an overnight stay at Trinity Hall, College tours, academic lectures and workshops. The students had a great time and found the trip very useful in preparation for their university applications.

Huish Sixth has long standing success of students progressing to Oxbridge and other Russell Group universities. Huish Sixth supports all of its students to develop the skills and knowledge which will allow them to realise their ambitions. This includes university visits, UCAS events, personal statement masterclasses, interview techniques and individual progression tutorials.



Our YR12 BTEC Applied Scientists visited ADM Protexin on the 7th July as part of their assignment linked to Healthy and Safety in a Laboratory Workplace. They were able to see the state-of-the-art facilities built at Lopen Head to produce innovative probiotics that are an ideal healthcare solution for animals and humans.

The students learned about the traceability of the production line and the safety audits carried out to maintain the high standards expected. In the microbiology lab they saw plate samples being taken and counted, In the chemical lab students observed the chromatography analyser in use and within production, the very technical machines at work packaging the products for shipment.

It was a really informative experience and one of a number planned for students on this course.

Other exciting news: Tom Francis, (YR12), spent a day at the Supreme Court of Justice last week following him entering a 'Big Voice London' competition as part of his quest to become a lawyer.

Tom explained this to us: "I applied for an introduction to law course with BVL and as part of it, I had to spend 5 weeks looking at the right to privacy, (Article 8), Vs the right to freedom of expression, (Article 10), using *Bloomberg V ZXC* as our case example. My report was in the top three so I was able to go and argue my point to legal professionals including the reknown QC Sara Mansoori. Even though I didn't win, it was an amazing experience"
