Speaking exam:

All students will be sitting (or have already!) a full mock speaking.



How can my child revise?

Past papers – but with caution!

- Speaking practice including with each other.
- Photo description practice
- After-school revision sessions to be confirmed



HOW CAN PARENTS HELP?

- Sit down with your child to create a plan on how they are going to revise for their language GCSE.
- Encourage your child to re-read their End of Year papers and the feedback on their last exams from their teachers.
- Quiz your child on vocabulary create 'vocab tests' or quiz them on flashcards. This
 should be from knowledge organisers, exercise books, and any other lists shared.
- Ensuring your child has somewhere quiet without distractions to do their revision work. This is especially important for doing listening practice.
- You don't need to know the language to help support your child! In the run up to the speaking exam, sit together for around 5-10 minutes a day and listen to them speaking through their conversation practice. You can follow the words from their conversation booklet/sheets and let them know if they miss any or, more importantly if they've got it right!



HOW CAN PARENTS HELP?

Tentatively.... AI can be your friend!

- ChatGPT prompts: "Create 10 questions for the wider conversation part of the German Edexcel GCSE Higher speaking exam on the topic of **My Personal World**'
- "Create 5 Reading texts and questions in the style of the new Edexcel GCSE in French for Higher Tier and provide a mark scheme"
- "Create a translation task (Spanish into English) in the style of the new Edexcel GCSE in Spanish Foundation Tier. Provide a mark scheme".



POST-16 OPPORTUNITIES

A-Level languages are an excellent way to broaden horizons even further.

Students who have language qualifications can earn 19% more than their monolingual counterparts. *

Even if students don't plan to study languages at university, the opportunities for 'sandwich years' are greatly improved if students have a second language.

Many courses offer 'sandwich years' which are opportunities for students to gain real word working experience – having a language means they can go and further their experience in their chosen field in a country which predominantly speaks that language.
