Bridging Work: Extended Project Qualification (EPQ)

Introduction/ Task 1

So, as you read through the resources, please use a pen and paper to take some draft notes of key learning points. This will involve skimming and scanning through the documents.

Then, please create some study notes running to about 2-3 sides of A4. How you present these is totally up to you: mindmap/ bullet points/ charts/ illustrations/ make a leaflet or a set of revision cards/ extended writing in paragraphs/ even create a sculpture, a short film, or record a Loom presentation or performance?! This task is to show us how you engage with the process of learning when you are free to make your own choices: have some fun!


Task 2

Use P-E-E-L paragraphing to create an introduction, to summarise what the results claim about you, and then create a new P-E-E-L paragraph about each of



the three main points you have discovered about yourself, followed by a brief concluding paragraph.

Do you agree with the results? Why? Does this confirm things you already felt? How might this survey impact on your learning in Huish Sixth?
