

## Geography Bridging Work

A Level geography is often divided into the two main spheres of geography: human geography and physical geography. You have a bridging task for each of these two spheres. You must complete both tasks below.

### Physical Geography Task

A study of the Jurassic Coast. You are going to create a short investigation into the Jurassic Coast; you can present your findings in a simple report – typed or hand written

**Introduction:** Map and location of Jurassic Coast including background which should explain what makes this coastline unique

**Erosional landforms:** Explanation of two landforms created by erosion on the Jurassic Coast. This should explain the natural processes that created them and the influence of geology on their formation – sketches or annotated photographs would really help. Good examples of erosional landforms are Lulworth Cove and Durdle Door

**Areas of coastal recession:** Where are the cliffs eroding at a relatively rapid rate again explain why and link to geology. You could look at Charmouth or Lyme Regis to see the impact of weathering on cliff recession.

**Depositional landforms:** What depositional landforms are found along the Jurassic coast and what physical processes formed them. The best example is Chesil Beach – again maps or diagrams are needed.
