# **Student finance:**

- Applications for 2024 starters will open in February date tbc. The deadline to apply to guarantee you receive funding for the start of your course is tbc; last year it was May 19<sup>th</sup>.
- Deferred entry apply next year.
- You do not need to have received all your offers or confirmed your place – complete the application and update it as necessary. You can also cancel your application if you change your mind.
- Remember to register on your course with your chosen university when you go or you won't receive your loans (universities will provide information on this).



# **Tuition fee loan:**

- Paid directly to your university
- Usually £9250 (foundation degrees / part-time may vary)
- Everyone is eligible for the full loan



# **Maintenance loan:**

- Paid into your student bank account, usually in 3 instalments –
   one at the start of each term.
- The amount you are eligible for depends on your taxable household income.
- The household is classed as where you usually live.
- The household income is the income of your parent(s) or one parent plus their partner living in the household, plus any independent source of income you have such as interest from savings, property etc.
- It does not include any money you will earn from work whilst you are away at university.
- The household will need to provide evidence of income

### A study into revision methods

So what revision techniques are out there and which ones are the most effective? There's no easy answer to that second question, but there are studies which give us some clues.

Back in 2013 Prof John Dunlovsky of Kent State University in the United States reviewed 1,000 scientific studies, looking at the ten most popular revision methods.



"Start by reading the text book, then make flash cards of the critical concepts and test yourself. A century of research has shown that repeated testing works."

Prof Dunlovsky

### The most effective techniques

The study looked at ten different revision methods such as highlighting and underlining, re-reading notes and writing summaries. Prof Dunlovsky and his team concluded that two of the methods tested came out on top.


### Spreading study out over time

Spreading your revision out over a longer period of time proved to be very effective. So get started as early as you can with revision and avoid cramming in the days before an exam.

# Music

"But I revise well listening to music"....

# Students who revise in quiet environments performed over 60% better than peers who revise listening to music that has lyrics

Your <u>working memory is limited</u>, and any background noise is 'cognitive overload' and will make learning much harder.



# Recreate the exam

- You sit the exam in silence, no music and no phone
- You have to revise in silence, with no music and no phone
- Create the same conditions as the exam or your memory will not work as well and you will be unable to recall your knowledge in as much detail
