Many of the sessions are led by Miss Donnellan - GCSE English Literature Senior Examiner Team Leader and Reviewer, and Mrs Noyce English Language Paper 2 Examiner. The schedule is published on the English year group Google Classroom. Each question or text will be revisited once before the final exams.

Tuesday's revision sessions will be aimed at Foundation tier students and Wednesday's will be predominantly for Higher tier.

Some students will receive a letter inviting them to a specific session on either the Tuesday or the Wednesday. If students do not receive a letter but still wish to partake in some after school support with their revision then there will also be a "drop in" session on the Wednesday. At this session a teacher will be there to help students with past paper questions that they might be struggling with.

Year 13 UCAS applicants (2024 entry)

Our Year 13 students have been receiving information and guidance on applying for Student Finance and how to budget at university. Applications for Student Finance are now open and anyone going to university this autumn should register and begin their application. The final deadline for completing the process is Friday 17th May - after this date applications can still be made but there is no guarantee that funding will arrive before the start of the course. It does not matter if students have not made their final decision on their firm choice of university at this stage - they should name the one they are most likely to go to and simply update their application if necessary.
